

## **GENERAL CITIZENSHIP STANDARDS**

The teachers of Hartland Day Academy feel that prospective students should understand clearly the standards and the aims toward which the school is directing its efforts. The ultimate object of education is the development of a Christian character. The character of the student is largely determined by the way he relates to the principles of Christian living and conduct. It is mutually agreed that every student who presents himself for admission to the school thereby pledges to willingly observe its regulations and to uphold the Christian principles. It is also understood that to break this pledge forfeits the student's membership, and if he is retained in the school, it is at the discretion of the faculty. It is also a part of the student's contract that he will, to the best of his ability, perform all the duties assigned to him in connection with the school. It would be the student's purpose to observe the regulations of the school as a matter of honor, realizing that these regulations have been found necessary to the successful guidance and education of young people. Only those should apply for admittance who are in agreement with the Christian standards of the school.

### **COOPERATION OF PARENTS**

The faculty strives to conduct all school activities both in and out of the classroom in accordance with the principles of the Bible and Spirit of Prophecy. The school earnestly solicits the cooperation of the parents of its students in helping to maintain and uphold these standards. We invite parents to keep in touch with the school so that all situations may be worked out for the best.

Every effort will be made by the faculty to help the student see the importance of abiding by the school rules. Discipline, when needed, will be designed not only as a punishment but also as a means of helping the student toward a more meaningful acceptance of Christian rules of conduct. However, if a student's progress or conduct is unsatisfactory, or if his spirit is manifestly out of harmony with the standards of the school, or his influence is found to be detrimental, he/she may be asked to withdraw at any time although there may have been no specific violations of any regulations.
